**What is Show Choir?**

The Daniel Wright Show Choir is an auditioned group of singers and dancers open to 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. Think "Glee" but without the drama. Show Choir focuses on musical theater, jazz/swing tunes, and pop, highlighting harmonized vocals with tight choreography.

**Why should I do it?**

If you love to sing and dance, this is the group for you! Show Choir provides a great opportunity to express yourself artistically, while helping you prepare for future musical events such as the annual school musical. Traditionally, the group has featured some of our best singers and dancers, and has typically been a group of highly energetic performers.

**When is it?**

Show Choir rehearses every Wednesday night from 6:15-7:45 p.m. at Daniel Wright, beginning September 14<sup>th</sup>. This means that students can participate in Show Choir practices and not have conflicts with current practice times for after school athletics, cheers, poms, and other extracurriculars.

**Auditions will be on Wednesday, September 7<sup>th</sup>** right after school until 4:00 p.m. Students will sing a 30-45 second section from a song of their choice, followed by the dance portion of the audition. The dance portion will be taught on the day of the auditions, and students will be assessed in small groups on their dancing abilities.
